#### **USE BY DATE/BEST BEFORE/BEST AFTER POEMS**

Below are examples of 'milk bottle Pop Art poems. Some can be perceived to have a deliberately high political quality to them; (but are meant to provoke thought and not offence). All these works are just a few examples of what I call Pop Art Poems as I feel the visual/graphic quality of letters was more consciously appropriated/explored in this post-war U.S. art movement. (The language experiments of DADA - which was an 'anti-art movement' that came about in disgust to the futile mass carnage of the First World War - also comes to mind). Thus the first poem directly references Andy Warhol although Roy Lichenstein also comes to mind.

On the milk bottle was a black & white photo of Nelson Mandela. Above it was BEST AFTER: 11 FEBRUARY 1990
